Q: Are there a couple ideas you would like to see in the upcoming NOAC?




Q: What do you want to encourage outside of NOAC?

The future of Success

Journey to Excellence

Beginning January 1st, 2012, the Quality Lodge Program will be replaced by the new Journey to Excellence Program. The Journey to Excellence (JTE) Program will achieve the same goal of the Quality Lodge Program, but in a way that more closely parallels the direction of the Boy Scouts of America and the Order of the Arrow as a whole, and is similar to the program that Councils, Districts, and Units are already using.

The JTE program encourages continuous progress compared to the Quality Lodge Program's definite restart point at the end of each year. By focusing on Finance, Program, Membership, Council Service, and Leadership and Governance, JTE sets a groundwork for improvement in any Lodge. In each of the five areas, Lodges will begin to set their own goals to meet over the course of a year. Some younger or small Lodges may make a goal in the area of Membership by growing in size by one member from the previous year and qualify for the Bronze level. Though this is the same minimum requirement from Quality Lodge, larger and more experienced Lodges may not have been challenged before to meet that requirement. This makes Lodges reach a 1% increase for Silver level and 3% for Gold level in the new JTE program. Lodges could settle and make only the Bronze level of Journey to Excellence, but now have incentive to reach higher goals.

Journey to Excellence will redefine the way Lodges plan each year's program while working closely to help develop Council's programs. Regardless of the size, location, and history of a lodge, everyone is given the opportunity to succeed. Following the Lodge Journey to Excellence program are similar Chapter and Section JTE programs. The Western Region is excited to see the Journey to Excellence Program take off! For more information, contact your Lodge Leadership or Section Leadership, or go to www. oa-bsa.org.
